- Managers, Coaches, Umpires & Parents Responsibilities -

Besides having our parents tend our concession stands as one of our financial responsibilities and respective duties it is important understand that our major responsibility is to ensure that our children are placed in an amicable environment. Let's not confuse competitiveness among our children's natural realm of playing with our-selves (adults) competing against each other. All managers, coaches and parents are responsible for observing the games with a reserve, amicable, courteous frame of mind. Rooting for your child and your child's team are always going to be a part of Westwood Baseball. However; please refrain from commenting aloud statements that would upset any other person at the field. For example; "Throw a strike Tommy the batter can't hit" or "come on Tommy you can hit this guy he has nothing". Please refrain from disruptive competitive cheering. Coaches, managers, umpires & parents shall not yell across the field at another coach, manager, umpire, parent or player in a hostile tone. Managers, coaches, players, or parents should not be exhibiting inappropriate behavior or negatively commenting aloud about our umpires, no matter what. If you are a coach or manager you are relied upon to lead by example. That means no arguing with our umpires, coaches, parents or players in front of our children. Westwood Baseball will be looking for zero tolerance when it encounters inappropriate behaviors. Managers and coaches should be concentrating on teaching our children how to play baseball, how to be good losers, how to be good winners and how to respect each other. Winning is meaningless, watching our children turn a double play, hit a line drive, or simply make a routine catch is priceless. Let the children control the outcomes of the game, not the coaches, managers and parents. Our job is to make sure that their early baseball experiences are remembered fondly. A good coach leads by example and encourages and rewards their players. A good coach doesn't yell at their players when they; have a bad inning, make a physical error, make a mental error, don't throw strikes, take strikes or is simply not paying attention. A good coach is never sarcastic, emphasizes education and doing well in school, and leads by example. Please think before you act and remember our children our watching and listening. Additionally, no player, coach, parent or umpire who participates, either directly or indirectly, in the programs or activities of the Westwood Baseball Association ("WBA") shall communicate and/or publish in any manner or forum, any words, comments, criticisms or other language directed to or about any other player, coach, parent or umpire of the Association which might potentially be viewed as defamatory. This regulation specifically includes communications of all types whatsoever, including spoken, written and/or electronic, and is designed to prevent potential claims for slander, libel and defamation against the WBA, its officers, directors, coaches and other volunteers. The prohibition against inappropriate electronic communications specifically includes e-mail, text messages, postings on social networking web sites and any other form of electronic communication not specifically referenced herein. Failure to adhere to these rules may result in immediate suspension of the child and/or the parent from playing and/or attending practices and games, at the discretion of the association's governing body.

***Insurance Reminder:** Our Accidental Insurance is a supplementary coverage, like all local town leagues, we could not afford nor would it be reasonable to pass the expense along to registration fees. That is why it expected when you sign-up that you understand that your own health insurance covers your child for any ordinary occurrences such as spraining an ankle when sliding, getting hit by a pitch, etc. However, our insurance will provide some supplementary coverage when this occurs. This type of Insurance plus two others that the Association needs to exist cost over \$4,000 per season. If you do not have Health Insurance for you children you might not want to participate.

Concession stand. You must honor your scheduled concession duties. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** No children under 18 are allowed in our concession stands. **NO GIVING AWAY CONCESSIONS TO YOUR (OR ANY) CHILD WITHOUT PAYMENT WHEN WORKING.**
